APICTA2013 delegates are invited to join the HKICC2013 conference sessions, while HKICC participants are entitled to attend the HKCS Gala Dinner cum APICTA2013 Award Presentation Ceremony on November 27 at HKCEC, to witness the birth of highest level of ICT award winners in the Asia Pacific region. Mr. C.Y. Leung, The Chief Executive of Hong Kong SAR, will be the officiating guest and preside over the award ceremony.
