Hong Kong Computer Society's FACE Club Opens Submission for the First Women Awards of the ICT Industry

17th June 2015, Hong Kong - FACE Club, established by the female members of Hong Kong Computer Society (HKCS), launches the "Outstanding ICT Women Awards 2015" (OICTWA), the first award recognizing and applauding women's contribution to and innovation within the ICT industry. OICTWA is now open for submissions until the end of July.

Mr. Michael Leung, President of HKCS and Chief Information and Operations Officer of China CITIC Bank International Ltd., said, "The ICT industry involves not only hardware but, more importantly, software and services. Contrary to stereotypical believes, many of the ICT positions, like user interface design, business and data analysts etc., are well suited to be taken up by women. Thus, we need to encourage more women to engage in the ICT sector, expanding the talent pool and furthering the growth of the industry."

Sharing the same belief in the value of women in the ICT industry, Prof. Tony Chan, President of HKUST, was invited to be Chairperson of the judging panel. Mr. Leung continued, "We are honored to have Prof. Chan's leadership in this first-ever Award program. He has always been an advocate of gender equality, and has contributed to supporting women's choices in pursuing study and career in various fields."

The award is divided to two categories: "Outstanding ICT Woman Professional" Category for female professionals and practitioners and "Outstanding ICT Super Girl" Category for female secondary and tertiary students.

Candidates will be evaluated based on the following set of criteria:

Outstanding ICT Woman Professional

- 1. Professional Contribution to ICT Industry
- 2. Leadership and Role
- 3. Past ICT Achievements
- 4. Community Contribution

Outstanding ICT Super Girl

- 1. Community Contribution
- 2. ICT-related Achievements and Innovative Use of ICT
- 3. Active Participation in ICT Industry Activities
- 4. Growth and Development

Mrs. Agnes Mak, MH, JP, Chairperson of the Organizing Committee of OICTWA cum Executive Director of Hong Kong Productivity Council, explains the reasoning behind the judging criteria, "In ICT professionals, we are looking at female individuals' consistent track record of contribution to and roles and responsibilities within the industry, including their leadership and ability to cultivate young talent. On the other hand, in Super Girls, we are looking for a promising growth and development in the sector; whether the female individuals are involved in or contributing to industry activities or demonstrating innovative use of and creative thinking in ICT."
